

# NEEDS ASSESSMENT PRIMARY EXAMPLE: COUNSELOR COPY

## Student Needs Survey (Grades 1–3)

**Directions:** Give each student a copy of the Student Needs Survey sheet. Explain to the students that you are going to ask them questions that will help you and other school helpers know more about them. You will read aloud a sentence and they will respond by circling Mr. Y if the answer is yes and Mr. N if the answer is no. Refer to the pictures to help the younger students keep their place on the worksheet.

1. (tree) I feel good about the way I do things.
2. (wagon) I do good work at school.
3. (ice cream cone) My teacher needs to remind me to follow the rules.
4. (cat) I tell someone when I have happy feelings.
5. (house) I tell someone when I have unhappy feelings.
6. (leaf) I know where to get help.
7. (blocks) I take turns and share in school.
8. (flower) My classmates like to be with me.
