The chair can refuse to schedule a bill for a committee hearing.

A majority vote of committee membership is required.

Conference Committee



Each conference committee must report to their respective chambers. Both the House and Senate must pass it before the bill goes to enrollment.



Failure to reconcile differences or gain a majority in either chamber.

The Governor may veto a bill, which the legislature may override by a 2/3 vote.
