





Per Capita Income

Persons without Health Care Insurance





Temporary Assistance for Needy Families

Eligible households receive monthly cash payments, through the electronic debit Lone Star Card.




Medicaid

Medical coverage for people with low income, and some elderly and disabled.



Medicare

Senior citizens who have paid into the system for ten years or more receive health coverage.




Children's Health Insurance Program State Children's Health Insurance Program
